Minutes of Meeting June 13, 2017

Meeting Called To Order at: 7:05 p.m.

Adoption of minutes of meeting of May 9, 2017

Treasurer's Report:

The Treasurer's report was read to those in attendance.

Old Business

- Matt Harvey asked if any more discussion had taken place regarding lifetime memberships. Blake Tibbetts and Bill Nason said it was a good idea, with a fee of \$1000 for the membership, but there had been no further action taken on the matter. It was recommended that it be proposed & moved to motion at the next annual meeting.
- Blake Tibbetts spoke on behalf of Dave Greene & asked again for more volunteers for our Scout Appreciation day coming up in September. There are 5 tasks that still need members to take ownership. Please contact Dave if you can help.

New Business

- Blake Tibbetts said there was an excellent response by the membership for our recent range work detail. Almost all the tasks were completed except for painting which was not possible due to the weather. Many thanks to all who volunteered their time to help keep our range functional; special thanks to Laval Roy for all his work with his tractor and also to Thomas Alchorn for his fabrication & welding skills.
- Blake Tibbetts read out several items that Dave Greene wanted mentioned at the meeting. Dave thanked the members who helped to move the old main seacan - John Leonard, Laval Roy, Todd Aube, & AJ Locke. Dave asked to purchase a cigarette receptacle for a cost of \$175 to address the problem of butts being dropped all over the range. Ear plugs need to be put in the garbage and not thrown on the ground. Pick up shell casings. Birdshot is not permitted on the range other than aerial targets (clays) – members are still using it on the 25/50 yard range despite signage warning against it. 22 caliber misfires are still ending up on the ground instead of the disposal can.
- Blake Tibbetts started a discussion about a point Dave Greene had asked to be brought up regarding having a public shoot day as is now the practice at several provincial ranges (Stoeger Day at St. Croix, Glock Day at Springfield). Bill Nason and Blake Tibbetts thought it was a good idea but there are many details that need to be examined such as finding a corporate firearms sponsor, volunteers (which are always an issue with club events), and security.
